### **Principals Report**

#### **NAIDOC** Week

Next week we will be celebrating NAIDOC week at the school. On Monday morning our school KESO Rod Briggs will be helping us launch the week with a special school assembly — I encourage anyone who is available to be there — it should be a great occasion. There will be other events throughout next week as we honour and respect our First nations students and culture at PNE.

### **Italian Day**

Monday was a special opportunity to celebrate our LOTE Italian program at PNE. The students did a wonderful job dressing up in all things Italian in red, green and white. We have a few Mario brothers, leaning towers of Pisa and Mona Lisa's on display. Thankyou to Cathy Palmas for organising the day. The children seemed to enjoy their incursion, gelati and soccer penalty shoot-out!

### **Roofing Works**

Commencing next week there will be some works being done throughout the school to enhance the school grounds. New drainage will be added to the back oval and improvements will be made to various buildings around the school, with a particular focus on the roofing. We do not expect this will impact any classes at this point and I will notify families if this is to happen. We expect most of the works to be completed during the school holidays.

#### After school pick ups

A reminder school finishes at 3.20pm daily and this is when children should be collected from inside the school grounds or begin to walk home. Our teaching staff are on duty after school until 3.30pm at which time they need to head home or attend meetings. Any child left unsupervised will be escorted to the office after this time.

While issues do occur and you can sometimes be late to collect your child, unfortunately some families have taken advantage of this situation on regular occasions. This severely impacts the capacity of staff to do any planning or other organisational work which needs completing outside of school hours.

We have a fantastic After care program and if you are unable to pick your child up by 3.30pm they should attend this service. The rates are affordable and supervision is provided until 6pm. Please contact the office if you would like more information about this service.




The main event will be presentations from some of our students about their family's culture and country.



# F-2 Area


Over the last couple of weeks, the area has been learning about writing an Information Report on Marine Animals. Please enjoy some interesting facts!























# 3/4 Area
