Student Attitude to School Survey results

This week the staff unpacked some of the annual survey results we receive back from our students. This data tells us about how our students are feeling about their learning, the school and their connection to their peers. The staff find this information invaluable as we work to improve our teaching and learning program throughout the school. There were, however some remarkable results which came through in this years survey.

- My Teacher expects students to pay attention 100% positive
- My teacher sets clear classroom rules for behaviour 96% positive
- My Teacher expects me to do my best 96% positive
- My Parents/caregivers believe school is important 100% positive
- At this school there is a teacher or adult that cares about me 95% positive

These results are for all students in years 4-6 (just under half of our school). It really reflects the great teacher-student relationships which underpin what we do at Preston North East Primary school. This trust and positive learning environment ensures our students are encouraged to take risks in the classroom and achieve their best.

Working with the year 2's this week, we started to explore if you have a problem (a bug), how we can break this problem down into smaller pieces to solve.

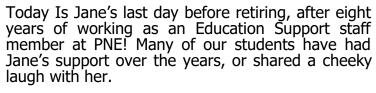
Step one – find the bug (problem), Step two – fix the bug and Step three – test the bug!

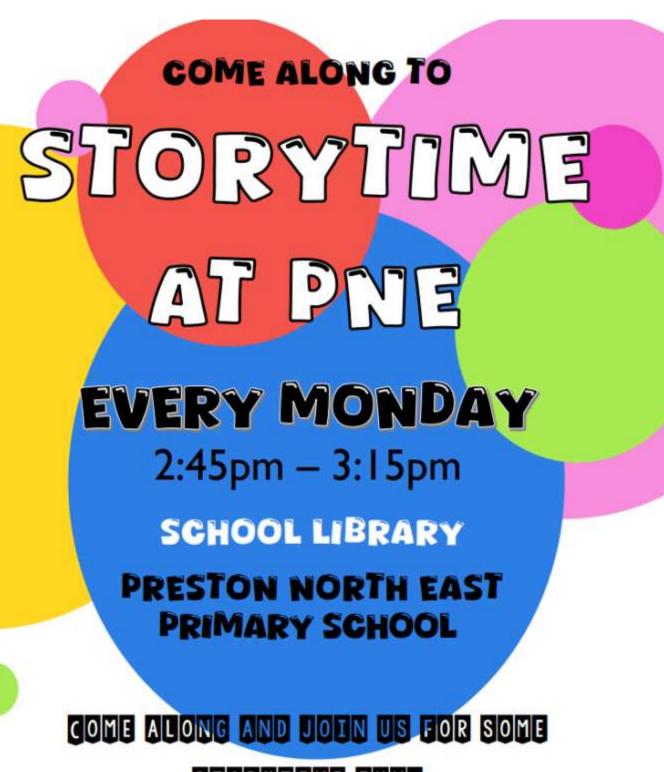
