Compass

Several years ago, our school made the decision (based on parent feedback) to move to the Compass portal in order to improve the speed and accessibility of school communication. Currently, parents are able to use the portal to book interviews, update student absences, give permission and pay for excursions.

At this time of year, we have many school excursions and events which we use Compass for. We have however, recently seen an increase in parents not responding to this in a timely manner. This has caused great difficulty for staff trying to plan excursions and other events. We need to ensure that we have the right number of staff on an excursion for



those who attend and enough back at school for those who are unable to attend. The online permission responses dictate how we organise these events.

If parents can please ensure they respond to notifications on Compass as soon as possible this will help with the smooth running of these events. Further, if you are having trouble, please reach out to our friendly office staff who are very happy to help.

NAPLAN results

I will be presenting our 2025 school NAPLAN results to school council on Monday evening. This year our results were very pleasing with most of our AIP targets achieved and exceeded:

Year 5 - Reading Strong and Exceeding from 61% (average 2023-2024) to 63%

Achieved 65%

Year 3 - Reading Strong and Exceeding from 56% (average 2023-2024) to 58%

Achieved 57%

Year 3 – Writing from 6% exceeding (average 2023-2024) to 8%

Achieved 20%

Year 5 – Writing from 10% exceeding (average 2023-2024) to 11%

Achieved 8%

Year 3 – Numeracy Strong and Exceeding from 46% to 50%

Achieved 54%

Year 5 – Numeracy Strong and Exceeding from 48% to 52%

Achieved 38%

NAPLAN is not and will never be the "be all and end all" of what school provide or a genuine indicator of what our school provides students and families, but these results are nonetheless an encouraging indicator of the great work happening in our classes and the excellent work of our teaching staff, students and families.


